# STATE WATER CONSERVATION COMMISSION Minutes of Meeting Held in Blue Room State Capitol Building November 3, 1953

A special meeting of the North Dakota State Water Conservation Commission was called to order on November 3, 1953, in the Blue Room, in the State Capitol Building, Bismarck, North Dakota, to discuss the creation of the Lower Heart River Water Conservation and Flood Control District. Governor Brunsdale called the meeting to order at 2:10 o'clock p.m. with the above mentioned persons present. To begin the discussion the Governor read excerpts of the Resolution from the Board of City Commissioners authorizing and directing them to execute and present a petition to the North Dakota State Water Conservation Commission for the creation and establishment of a water conservation and flood control district within the basin of the Lower Heart River in Morton County and the Petition for the creation and establishment of a water conservation and flood control district within the basin of the Lower Heart River in Morton County signed by the Mayor and the members of the Board of City Commissioners of the City of Mandan, North Dakota.

Governor Brunsdale asked if the County of Morton and the City of Mandan had agreed on the boundary limits of the proposed district. Mr. Gallagher, City Attorney for Mandan, explained that the City Commissioners had held a meeting in the forenoon of November 3, 1953, and had amended a petition agreeing with Morton County on the boundary of the district.

John Handtmann, Mayor of the City of Mandan, thought that the boundary of the flood control district should be extended to include the refinery being built by the Standard Oil Company northeast of the City of Mandan.

Mr. George J. Toman, City Engineer of Mandan, pointed out the outline of the proposed flood control district on a map that he had brought along. He estimated that there were probably about 18 sections or 11,620 acres of land included in the area but did not as yet have a definite total. Mr. Tolman went on to explain the present dyke system of Mandan and how they had been topped by flood waters in the spring of 1952.

During the 1952 flood, Mr. Toman had taken an aerial view of Mandan and the surrounding vicinity and said that the land from a point about 800 yards from U.S. Highway 10 southwest of Mandan was all underwater at that time.

Mr. Gallagher asked Col. H. L. Hille, District Engineer, Garrison District, U. S. Army Engineers, to explain the protective works plan to those present. Col. Hille requested Mr. E. G. Erickson, a member of his staff of the U. S. Army Engineers, to explain the plan that was favored by most of the local people. He also explained that the plan is being expanded since the last three floods have shown that the plan as it was first submitted would not be sufficient to hold the waters of the recent floods.

Mr. Handtmann wanted to know what would happen to the old river channel, where the Mandan sewage is deposited, if and when a new channel was made. Mr. Erickson explained that a certain amount of water would be let through the old channel and the new channel would only be an added protection during the flood stage.

Another plan is also being considered to build 3 or 4 small dams downstream from the Heart Butte Dam to store some of the water during the flood period.

Governor Brunsdale called on Mr. I.A. Acker, Special Assistant Attorney General for the State Water Conservation Commission, to explain the procedure that has to be gone through before a district can be created. Mr. Acker explained to those present that the Commission believes, even though the law does not require it, that a hearing of the petition for the establishment of the district should be held. After such a hearing the Water Commission may

grant or deny the petition to create the district. A copy of the order establishing the district must be filed with the County Auditor and also with the Secretary of State. Directors are selected by the Board of County Commissioners with the County Auditor as ex-officio secretary for the district.

Mr. Acker also explained that the Board of County Commissioners may levy a tax of 3 mills and also special assessments against lands benefited by the project.

If, when the plans by the Corps of U.S. Army Engineers are completed, and the local people consider the amount of money needed too high, the District does not have to go ahead with the construction of the project, even though the District is created.

Commissioner Curtis Olson offered the following resolution and moved . its adoption which motion was seconded by Commissioner Earle F. Tucker.

WHEREAS, the State Water Conservation Commission has been petitioned by the board of County Commissioners of Morton County, North Dakota, and also by the City Commission of the City of Mandan, North Dakota, to create a water conservation and flood control district consisting of territory within the lower Heart River basin in order to provide an agency through which local interests may cooperate and contract with the federal government and furnish required assurances of local cooperation for the establishment of a project for the improvement of the lower Heart River in order to prevent damage by floods;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED: That notice be given that said petitions for the establishment of the proposed water conservation and flood control district will be heard November 24, 1953, in the memorial building in the City of Mandan at two o'clock in the afternoon of that day, mountain standard time, and that any person having an interest may appear at said hearing and show cause, if any he has, why such district should or should not be established.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That notice of said hearing be published once prior to the date thereof in a newspaper of general circulation in Mandan and surrounding community.

Upon roll call by Governor Brunsdale, all Commissioners voted age and motion carried.

The meeting was adjourned at 3:40 o'clock p.m.
